Derek Lowry: Big Game Chair – Rick said good re-reaction. 14 on first Second day 20 entries. 34 in total this year only 24 last year. Heinz Plontke – advertising at different locations in town. Chairs should be at meetings voicing concerns and tell general members. Sheila coordinating information sessions for public
